## SINGULAR & PLURAL NUMBER

### Recapitulation:

In our previous two worksheets on **Singular and Plural** we had learnt about the different rules of changing a singular noun to plural noun:

- a) by adding –s
- b) by adding –es
- c) by changing –y to –ies
- d) by changing –f or –fe to –ves. We had also learnt some special cases. Hope you remember them all.

## Today's lesson:

Today we shall learn about some more special cases.

1) There are some naming words that do not follow any of the rules we had learnt earlier. They need to be completely changed to form their plural forms.

For example-

**Singular**

**tooth**

**Plural**

**teeth**

<b><u>Singular</u></b>	<b><u>Plural</u></b>
(a) child	(a) children
(b) foot	(b) feet
(c) goose	(c) geese
(d) mouse	(d) mice
(e) man	(e) men
(f) woman	(f) women
(g) ox	(g) oxen

2) There are some nouns that remain the same in the plural form.

For example-

<u>Singular</u>	<u>Plural</u>
deer	deer
sheep	sheep

Let's see some more nouns that do not change-

- a) articles of dress- shoes, socks, jeans, trousers
- b) tool- scissors
- c) subject- Mathematics
- d) sports- gymnastics
- e) other nouns- news, spectacles, innings.

3) Some nouns remain the same in the plural form if they are used to denote many of the same kind, but change if they are used to denote many of different species or kinds.

For example -

<u>Singular</u>	<u>Plural</u>
fish	fish (if they are of same kind)
fish	fishes (if they are of different kinds /species)
fruit	fruit (if they are all of the same kind)
fruit	fruits (if they belong to different kinds)
