How are you today?

I am back again with two new concepts of grammar....

*(Please read the chapters from your **EVERYDAY ENGLISH GRAMMAR and COMPOSITION BOOK-5** as well as the attached notes. Then work out the exercises neatly in your notebooks henceforth. Leave both the sides of the first page blank, to be used as the **Contents page** with columns under the heads: date, worksheet number, chapter number, chapter name and teacher's signature. Ensure neat and tidy work. **Follow the exact pattern given below.**)*

Sheela *likes* chocolate. ~ *Does* Sheela *like* chocolate?

They *like* chocolate. ~ *Do* they *like* chocolate?

Ali *liked* chocolate. ~ *Did* Ali *like* chocolate?

Nitin *drank* a lot of milk yesterday. ~ *Did* Nitin *drink* a lot of milk yesterday?

- If the main verb in the statement is *is*, *am*, *are*, *was* or *were*, we change the sequence of words to form the question.

Rani *is* a typist. ~ *Is* Rani a typist?

I *am* a dancer. ~ *Am* I a dancer?

You *are* a singer. ~ *Are* you a singer?

Farah *was* ill yesterday. ~ *Was* Farah ill yesterday?

They *were* tired. ~ *Were* they tired?

- If the verb in the statement has two words, we place the first word (the helping verb) at the beginning of the sentence.

Tarun *has completed* school. ~ *Has* Tarun *completed* school?

Lincy *is eating* grapes. ~ *Is* Lincy *eating* grapes?

We *were singing* prayers. ~ *Were* we *singing* prayers?

They *had written* many poems. ~ *Had* they *written* many poems?

Now, it's time to move on to the next concept :

SUBJECT AND PREDICATE

Do you know the meaning of these two words?

Every complete sentence contains two parts: a subject and a predicate. The subject is what (or whom) the sentence is about, while the predicate tells us something about the subject. The predicate contains the verb.

Examples :

1) *Snow White and the Seven Dwarfs is a good book. (DECLARATIVE/ASSERTIVE SENTENCE)*

Subject - *Snow White and the Seven Dwarfs*

Predicate - *is a good book.*

2) *The students of Class V went for the trip. (DECLARATIVE/ASSERTIVE SENTENCE)*

Subject - *The students of Class V*

Predicate - *went for the trip.*

3) *Make hay while the sun shines. (IMPERATIVE SENTENCE)*

Subject - *You*

Predicate - *make hay while the sun shines.*

**** Note that, though the subject usually isn't obvious in an imperative sentence, it's there. The subject is always in the second person and is always the word "You". In Imperative sentences, the subject isn't written, but is implied.**

4) *Where is the Kapoor Mansion located? (INTERROGATIVE SENTENCE)*

Subject - *The Kapoor Mansion*

Predicate - *is located where?*

5) *How friendly the chairman behaves !* (EXCLAMATORY SENTENCE)

Subject - *The Chairman*

Predicate - *behaves how friendly !*


